# From the President Sara Bidner

Advocacy, Professional Development, and Appreciation

The nature and delivery of education as we have known it is changing, creating new challenges for teachers every day and sometimes threatening programs. It has become increasingly essential that music educators project a strong and united voice for keeping music and the arts in the forefront of the legislative decision-making process on school curriculum. The National Association for Music Education (NAfME), our umbrella association that serves as the voice for all areas and levels of school music education, preschool through higher education, is working diligently to promote and support the ongoing presence of quality music education for all students in schools throughout the nation.

The Executive Director and the advocacy staff of the National Association for Music Education have been leading the force to maintain music and the arts as "core subjects" in the language of any reauthorization of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA). Each summer there is a Capitol Hill Day sponsored by NAfME, during which teams of state MEA officers visit their legislators to urge support

of music education. In 2012, NAfME initiated the formation of the Music Education Policy Roundtable to unify all music education advocacy organizations in achieving a consensus of federal legislative goals. This Roundtable meets regularly and, through its united front, has had a significant impact on the recognition and promotion of music education in legislative committees. The Louisiana Music Educators Association is a federated state organization of the National Association for Music Education. Every state has a federated association within NAfME, and information for each state association can be found on the NAfME website (www.nafme.org), under Quick Links—Federated State Associations. It is incumbent upon us to promote music education at the grass roots level to ensure the continuation of music programs for our students. If you need support for your own programs and want assistance, go to the Advocacy page (http://advocacy.nafme.org/), or call the NAfME headquarters and simply ask for assistance.

Professional Development

The LMEA Annual Conference will be held in Baton Rouge at the Crowne Plaza Hotel November 21-25, 2013. Be sure to put this on your calendar and send in your registration! Look for the program schedule on the LMEA website (www.lmeamusic.org), and also in the November issue of the Louisiana Musician. The conference will feature six All-State performance ensembles, guest ensemble performances, exhibits by various vendors, and many clinic sessions that you won't want to miss. One of the most profitable gains and personal rewards in attending the Conference is the opportunity to network with colleagues and friends, so be sure to attend the socials on Thursday and Saturday nights!

Two events have been planned for music teachers, program directors, and administrators that will provide professional development at the national level. The NAfME National In-Service Conference will take place in Nashville at the Gaylord Opryland Resort October 27-30, 2013. Prior to the Conference, a two-day Preconference session on Teacher Evaluation and Music Assessment will discuss measurements for music learning. Both of these events will provide outstanding sessions on topics that are of timely value to music teachers throughout the country. And in appreciation . . .

A change that is affecting education in the state is the recent elimination of numerous staff positions at the State Department of Education. Among the positions cut was that of the Coordinator of Fine Arts Programs, held by Dr. Richard Baker. Although this change may not be felt immediately by individual schools, this position historically has coordinated the establishment of state standards and benchmarks, model lessons for the music classroom, adoption procedures for state textbook and resources, assessment strategies for arts teachers, and teacher evaluation guidelines in the creative arts. This position will be sorely missed for providing leadership in standards-based instruction and maintenance of quality arts programs in the state. We especially appreciate Dr. Baker's diligence in disseminating relevant news and research in the field of music education through his e-Bulletins in the Arts, and his contribution to the work of the national committee for rewriting the arts standards.

As we move forward, please take every opportunity to advocate for the importance of music education in schools—at concerts, community events, school board meetings, and conversations with parents and local legislators. At this time of transition, it will be up to us to carry the flame for our programs and to emphasize the difference they make in students' lives. It will be crucial that we make our voices heard in support of the ongoing benefits gained by students from music experiences in school.

# President-Elect Sharon McNamara-Home

As I write this, I am reflecting on the recent birth of my second grandchild. All is well and he is a healthy, alert 8 lb. 14.9 oz. baby boy! However, there were complications at his birth and he was in NICU for several days. During that time, it was so important for the family to be together – each searching for answers; each providing strength and support for the others; each validating another's emotions (fear, uncertainty, frustration, isolation, lack of being in control); and, yes, each sharing the hope that all would be well.

As I process the events of those days, I realize how similar some of my emotions were to the ones I'd felt last year at school! I recently had lunch with Anthony Sears – friend, fellow choral director, and current LA-ACDA president. As I shared and reflected on the difficulties I'd "survived" last year, he listened, affirmed, asked questions, made suggestions, and tried to help me refocus on the future rather than the past. Perhaps the most important thing he said was, "Sharon you need to become a mentor." Perhaps the unspoken part was two-fold: I'm not the only one experiencing difficulties and we have much that we can offer each other when we connect.

At a time when there is a push for global education, an emphasis on technology, new standards and assessments, and instant world-wide communications, most of us are being forced to rethink teaching strategies. We must learn from each other's strengths! We must keep


an open mind and think outside the box! We must be willing to make changes! We must remember that when we work together, we'll have a better chance of finding understanding and answers! We must become mentors for each other.

A few years ago, leaders of various professional music organizations got together and created The Music Education Policy Roundtable as a vehicle to talk through common/shared problems and work together to find solutions. Its members include ACDA, AOSA, American School Band Directors Association, American String Teachers Association, Chorus America, DCI, Education through Music, The Gordon Institute, The Grammy Foundation, iSchoolMusic.org, League of American Orchestras, MTNA, NAfME, NAMM, the National Music Council, OAKE, Percussive Arts Society, Quadrant, The Recording Academy, and VH1's Save the Music Foundation. No single organization is more important than another. Each organization is valued for its unique strengths and point of view. Together, all members search for answers. Single threads will break, but when woven together they become a strong rope!

Did you realize that the LMEA board includes ex-officio members from ACDA, AOSA, IAJE, LBA, and LAKE? Each has unique strengths to contribute; we have common problems to solve! And all believe that music education plays a vital role in a child's development.

Mentoring? We automatically do it when a family member is in crisis. But in the work place, are we aware of fellow teachers who are in difficult, uncertain, frustrating, or out-of-control situations? Do we seek out ways to help "stabilize" and nurture them? Do we reach out to new teachers? Have you told them we have both an instrumental and a vocal guide for new teachers on the website? Do we spend time with experienced teachers, sharing ideas or asking questions? I would encourage LMEA members to make "mentoring" a priority – to reach out and network with other teachers, both young teachers and experienced teachers. Start in your district or parish!

#### The Common Core and You

The Teacher Evaluation System (Compass/SLTs) was the subject of last September's editorial. With a year of that under our belt, it's time to tackle the next subject in this brave new world.

Hopefully in 2014, the editorial will focus on new National Standards in music education. But as a prelude in 2013, we need to recognize what Common Core really is and how it impacts us as music educators.

There are three components of the Common Core that we need to understand. The first component only deals with content as it relates to English, mathematics, socials studies and science. But the other two components impact all teachers including music educators.

#### **Three Components of Common Core**

- ➤ Curriculum Content Core teachers
  - Initial focus on Mathematics and ELA
  - Literacy standards in Science and Social Studies.
- ➤ Instructional Concepts/Shifts All Teachers
- ➤ Assessment Practices and Item Design All Teachers

Music educators are engaged in the Common Core. As a matter of fact, the more you look at it the more you will be convinced that we have been doing this our entire careers.

All Teachers are engaged in the Common Core. Just Connect the Danielson Rubric to the Compass Evaluation System to the Common Core Components.

See the Instructional Connections for All Teachers
Constructivism: discovery, hands-on, student centered, experiential, collaborative, project-based, engaging, and task-based learning. Everything a music teacher does touches on all of the elements of constructivism. You couldn't prepare for any performance without all of these elements.

See the Assessment Connections for All Teachers

Assessment Design: real-world, multi-step, deep understanding, best answer vs. right answer, evidenced-based argument vs. persuasive argument, and referencing evidence. Performance is real world. We aren't interested in just the right notes. We are striving to have our student understand the music in depth and demonstrate this in daily performance. We look for the best in each performance not just that which is mechanically correct.

Greetings, and here's hoping you've had a relaxing summer and are ready to kick off another school year.

#### First Round All State Auditions

All first round auditions must be held by the last Saturday of September. All first round results need to be delivered to me via email no later than 12:00pm Sunday, September 29, 2013. Make sure that you have senior preferences before submitting 1<sup>st</sup> round results. Please be prompt so that information can be assimilated and disseminated in a timely fashion. District directors, if you have any specific questions about senior preferences and district allotments, please contact me as soon as possible.

#### **Second Round All State Auditions**

Second round All-State auditions will be held on Saturday, October 12, 2013 at Lafayette High School in Lafayette, Louisiana. I would like to thank in advance the fine staff at Lafayette High School, Scotty Walker, Ronnie Gleason and Steve Wilson as they open their facilities to our students. Make sure you take the time to thank them for their service!

Senior wind and percussion students who audition for All-State membership will indicate their preference for band or orchestra at their first round auditions. In assigning students to band and orchestra, only senior preferences will be honored. If a senior's rank places him or her in an unfavorable ensemble, the next highest ranked player will fill that ensemble's slot.

Registration for second round auditions will begin at 7:45 am and close at 8:15 for the students in districts 3, 4 and 5 only. Registration for districts 1,2, and 8 will begin at 9:00am and close at 9:30 am. The final registration for districts 6,7 and 9 will be open at 12:00pm and close at 12:30pm. You must register during your district's allotted time. Students who do not show up for their registration window will not be allowed to register. The registration fee for second round is \$50.

Directors, please be advised that we will be using a new registration process for all state students this year. As soon as the second round results are posted, all registration forms will be available on the LMEA website. Students are to download, print and fill out the registration forms which are then

sent to the appropriate LMEA officer. Also, participation fees are to be paid by school check, booster club check or money order for each school's participating students. Please make sure that all student and director hotel reservations are made as soon as possible after the conclusion of second round auditions since there is a home LSU game on Saturday and hotel rooms will go fast!

#### **LMEA Conference**

LMEA Conference will be held in Baton Rouge, Louisiana at the Crowne Plaza, November 21-25. All-state Band members will report on Saturday, November 23, 2013. The All-State Symphonic Band will register at 4:00pm; the All-State Concert Band will register at 6:00pm. The concerts will begin at 2:00pm on Monday, November 25, 2013. The conductor of the 2013 All State Concert Band will be Dennis Hopkins and the Symphonic Band Conductor will be Colonel Larry Lang. I would like to send out a heartfelt word of thanks to Daphne Richardson for chairing the Concert Band and Richard Bresowar for chairing the Symphonic Band.

Begin planning now to attend our annual conference, and don't miss the Band Division meeting to be held on Sunday morning.

Before Second Round Auditions District Audition Chairmen Should Do The Following:

Observe the deadline to email your <u>second round pre-registration form</u>: September 30 to fwhebert@gmail.com. Please include the names of your monitor, your director designated for packet pick-up, and the contact numbers and emails of all directors sending students to second round. Be certain to identify handicapped and vision-impaired students on this form as well.

Pay district audition fees (\$12 per participant) no later than the LMEA board meeting, Saturday, October 5.

**Alternates are Pre-Registered by phone only. Thursday, October 10** is the pre-registration deadline for alternates. Only pre-registered students will be allowed to audition as per LMEA board policy. Contact me by phone no later than the pre-registration deadline to replace one of your students listed on your <u>second round pre-registration form</u> with <u>your district alternate</u>.

Should a district submit vacant audition slots in their initial 40-student allotment, I will contact district audition chairmen by phone in a sequential order to fill these vacancies. Any district accepting these open slots must pay the \$12 audition fee prior to the audition.

At Second Round Auditions (Saturday, October 12, Lafayette High) every student is expected to present a STUDENT ID at Sign-In.

Immediately After Second Round Auditions All Participating Directors Should Do The Following:

Check the LMEA website: <a href="www.lmeamusic.org">www.lmeamusic.org</a> for the posting of students selected as prospective All-State Choir members. **NEW PROCESS:** Student registration forms (Form#1, Form#2, and the Academic Excellence Form) are on the website and must be printed, completed and returned to the address on the form. These forms will no longer be included in the student packet. **October 22** is the deadline to submit the three completed forms along with the registration fee of \$55. **NEW PROCESS:** *Payment is made to LMEA by school check or money order only. No personal checks accepted.* 

Contact the director designated to distribute all-state registration packets for your district and arrange to pick-up your members' packets with urgency immediately after the audition weekend.

Supervise the completion and mailing of student all-state packet forms and fee check. Thank you, directors, for taking the time to do this. Mail all of your school's entries in one envelope. Your involvement improves the efficiency of this process.

Directors, please make sure to complete and mail your Conference Registration with fee check to LMEA Past President, Scotty Walker, 108 Benton, Lafayette 70507. Your registration for the convention is necessary in order for your students to participate. There is no need to send a copy of this form to me.

Be sure to reserve your conference hotel rooms on Monday, October 14, following second round auditions: Crowne Plaza Hotel, 4728 Constitution Avenue, Baton Rouge, 225-930-0174 or 225-930-0130.

#### Your Help in This Matter is Crucial:

Please contact me ASAP should one of your registered all-state choir members withdraw from the all-state event. I have about a 7-day-window after the October 22 all-state choir registration deadline to secure alternates and submit their names for the printed program.

State Choir Festival 2014 is the week of April 28 and State Solo Festival 2014 is Saturday, May 3. Both events will host at UL Lafayette.



It is, after all, America's art form. If you have *not* been able to do so, please consider starting a jazz ensemble, jazz combo, or jazz vocal group within your program. Members of the **Louisiana Association for Jazz Education** will be glad to assist with any information you might need about getting something started. Please don't ever hesitate to ask questions when starting a jazz program. It will be a fantastic addition to your program and will offer your students a well-rounded school music experience.

Please check the websites for the 2013 audition requirements and check that your students are practicing the correct selections. The required selections (Set 2) and their instructions are listed on both of the above websites. Prepared audition selections come from the **Jazz Conception** series by Jim Snidero. ALL students will be required to perform **with** the accompaniment recording and should supply their own copy of the sheet music or book; we will provide the accompaniment recordings at the auditions. Please tell your students to **practice** with the recordings prior to the day of the auditions in the warm-up area. Scale requirements for the various instruments are the same as All-State band auditions and there will be sight-reading in a jazz style.

Students should come prepared and on time for their scheduled audition time. All auditioning students are required to check in at the jazz auditions registration table to receive their audition number no less than 30 minutes prior to their audition time. Those students auditioning for jazz AND band, orchestra, or choir must indicate their first second and third choice of preference in case they are chosen for more than one All State ensemble. Students must indicate the *same* choice at *all* registration tables. Students who are only auditioning for jazz ensemble will not indicate a preference since their only choice is jazz. This year's clinician for the 2013 LMEA All-State jazz ensemble will be James Ketch, trumpet instructor and Director of Jazz Studies at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. He is a Summit Record recording artist, artist-clinician for the Conn-Selmer Corporation and a faculty member of both the Jamey Aebersold Summer Jazz Workshops and the Savannah Music Festival's *Swing Central* program.

James Ketch's career reveals a deep passion for the performance and teaching of music. He is a versatile and experienced artist with considerable skills in both the classical and jazz idioms. He has performed at 15 conferences of the International Trumpet Guild, including featured or solo performances at conferences held at the University of Kentucky, Ohio State University, Ithaca College, and Arizona State University. Ketch has appeared as soloist, recitalist, chamber musician and clinician in hundreds of concert and educational venues across the nation. His classical and jazz performances include solo recitals, guest artist appearances with orchestras, bands, and jazz ensembles, and a wide variety of chamber and commercial music. His versatility as a performer is quite notable. He performs music ranging from Louis Armstrong to Pat Metheny and from J.S. Bach to Tori Takimitsu.

Mr. Ketch is a Bach/Selmer Paris trumpet artist and clinician for the Conn-Selmer Corporation. Mr. Ketch, serving as artist-clinician and consultant, has joined with Marcus Roberts in providing the leadership for the creation of the Savannah Music Festival's *Swing Central*. His articles on trumpet issues and jazz studies have appeared in the Journal of the International Trumpet Guild, the Journal of the International Association of Jazz Education, and the North Carolina Music Educator.

As an educator, Professor Ketch is the recipient of the two highest teaching awards granted by the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. Mr. Ketch's students have appeared in Conferences of the International Trumpet Guild as finalists in the Mock Orchestra and Jazz Improvisation Competitions. Former students perform professionally in orchestras and military ensembles, are active educators at both the university, collegiate and high school levels, and pursuing graduate study at leading universities across the country.

"The things I learned from my experience in music in school are discipline, perseverance, dependabilty, composure, courage, and pride in results...Not a bad preparation for the workforce!"—Gregory Anrig, Educational Testing Service Although I'm fairly sure most of us do not want to think about the Educational Testing Service, it is very interesting that Mr. Anrig made the above comments regarding our subject matter. While our purpose in life is to do more than prepare our students for the work force, the reality is that — hopefully — all of our pupils will land a meaningful job.

We have survived the first year of the COMPASS evaluation system and have maneuvered successfully through the SLT process. I must say, I was pleasantly surprised at the impact the entire experience had on my teaching. I am very thankful to Mr. Pat Deaville, music supervisor in Calcasieu Parish, for walking all of us through the procedure.

"The schools that produce the highest academic achievement in the United States today are spending 20% to 30% of the day on the arts, with special emphasis on music." International Association for the Evaluation of Educational Achievement (IAEEA)

I know that the students at my school do not spend 20% to 30% of the day on the arts, but perhaps our principals, superintendents, board members, and parents should see the above quotation and realize we could be doing a much better job preparing our youth for life with more – not less – music instruction. What is good for your classroom also is good for you. **Yes, you!** The annual LMEA conference is being planned as this magazine goes to press, and it is crucial that all music teachers support this in-state, inexpensive conference that gives you access to quality sessions and clinics presented and taught by experienced music teachers from our state in addition to those who are nationally known. Elementary sessions begin on Thursday afternoon and are finished by Saturday at 1 pm – even though it's less than two percent of our school year, it will rejuvenate, re-educate, and re-inspire you.

As always, I culled through the evaluations from last year's conference and planned sessions based on what attendees said they wanted. Here is a brief rundown on what will be offered in November.

Dr. Sarah Bartolome from LSU will present two sessions based on her experiences last year in Lithuania. Her first session, "Šoktim! Lithuanian Folk Dance for the General Music Classroom", will be presented on Thursday, and her second session scheduled for Friday is, "Dainuokim! Lithuanian Music for the General Classroom". Dr. Bartolome has been with us the last two years, and her sessions always are wonderfully presented and full of new and exciting ideas.

The Louisiana Association of Kodály Educators (LAKE) and the Red Stick Chapter of the American Orff-Schulwerk Association will team together to present two sessions specifically devoted to SLTs, assessment, and COMPASS requirements. This is one of the areas most of you selected as your main concern, so we are excited four local teachers have agreed to provide these sessions.

Dr. Susan Brumfield will be this year's main attraction and will expand on her sessions from last year. She will spend a good deal of time on songs and pedagogical tools for the music classroom, and hopefully she will present a reading session as well. Specific titles and descriptions of her clinics will be listed in our November Louisiana Musician issue.

Ruth Dwyer has not been to LMEA in at least 10 years, but she made such an incredible impression that each year she is requested to make another appearance. This year we were able to get her to add us to her schedule. Her presence is made possible through the generosity of LAKE. She will provide three sessions for us.

Speaking of generosity, the Red Stick Chapter will be bringing in Brent Holl who will offer three sessions: "Focus on Improvise", "Marimba Jam", and "Rondo: an Orff Classic (Help me, Rondo)!" We are grateful to Red Stick and LAKE members for their commitment to bring in nationally-known clinicians each year.

Other sessions slated this fall are two presented by Dancing Drum — "Drumming Up World Music: West African Rhythms and Songs" and "Drumbeat for Success: Teaching Good Character through Music". As you can see, great care has been taken to organize the elementary sessions for our conference. The next step is for you to: 1) put attendance at the conference as one of the items on your Professional Growth Plan, 2) put the conference dates, Thursday, Nov. 21-Saturday, Nov. 23, on your calendar, 3) pre-register for the conference, 4) reserve a room or stay with a friend, and 5) get ready to have a wonderful time incorporating new teaching ideas into your curriculum to give your students the most joy and love for music as possible.






