New Login: Beginning this year, some of our forms will require you to login. As a result of NAfME's newly completed database upgrade, there is a slightly different login process for both LMEA and NAfME. (Your membership will have to be current to login.)

The first time you login, you'll need to click on "**Sign Up**." Enter the email you used to renew your membership and a password of your choice. You'll be sent a verification email and will need to click "Confirm Your Account." That's all. If you have any problems, email <u>memberservices@</u> <u>nafme.org</u>. They are not staffed 24/7 so you will only get an answer during their extended business hours, but they have been replying and fixing problems very quickly. If you cannot get a problem resolved, email me and I'll try to help you work through it. **NOTE: If your email address has changed, you'll need to email** <u>memberservices@nafme.org</u> **to have them change it in their records before the login process can be completed.**

Manage Profile – when you log in to either LMEA or NAfME, you have the option to update the information in your profile. Just be sure to click "save." It's way down at the bottom of the page.

Hi Friends and Colleagues...

Welcome to another school year. I'm looking forward to one as successful or more so for LMEA participants this year. Here is the information for the upcoming year you are looking for:

Dr. Andre J. Thomas, Owen F. Sellers Professor of Music at The Florida State University – will be our clinician for the concert choir in November 2017.

Ms. Angie Rawls of Pearl, Miss. Will be the women's clinician.

The 2017 All-State Choir First Round audition piece is "Heilig" by Mendelssohn, SSAATTBB(Double Choir), Walton Music Corp. (W2163).

The 2nd round audition piece is Handel's To Thee Cherubim and Seraphim edited and adapted by Favazza (Hinshaw – HMC2530). Yes, it is only in 5 parts (SSATB) but it is a great choice for our audition. Sopranos will divide sop 1 and sop 2 as always. Alto 1 and 2 will sing the alto part, Tenor 1 and 2 will sing the Tenor part and Bass 1 and 2 will sing the Bass part. The parts cover the ranges necessary for all the other pieces to be performed this year at all-state.

We will still have 8 separate audition rooms as usual, there will be no combining.

This might tempt a few more students to audition on more than one part. Where there is nothing to prevent a student from auditioning on more than one part, we are asking that this be limited as we want to give as many students as possible a chance to audition and be a part of the LMEA All-State choirs.

The audition/rehearsal tracks (Thanks Jude Wilson and Sharon McNamara-Horne) for 1^{st} and 2^{nd} round are posted online on the LMEA website The individual parts listed are for rehearsal – everyone will audition with the accompaniment track.

Audition times for each district are listed below – pretty much the same as last year. Remember – we are back in Pineville on October 14th this year due to some conflicts at Lafayette for the audition date.

In preparation for all-state choir membership, students must learn the *entire* first round selection even if the district chooses only a portion of the song to audition. Audition Chairmen must submit all district entries for Second Round to me no later than September 30. The entry is valid upon payment of the fee of \$12 per student. Ideally, your entry form and check should be sent together. However, I must receive the entry form by Saturday, September 30, 2017 and your district fees (\$15 per participant) must be paid no later than October 7, 2017, the LMEA board meeting date. Fees for alternate slots are due that day as well.

BEFORE SECOND ROUND AUDITIONS DISTRICT AUDITION CHAIRMEN SHOULD DO THE FOLLOWING:

Observe the deadline to email your second round pre-registration form: September 30th to <u>michaeltownsend@charter.net</u>. Please include the names of your monitor, your director designated for packet pick-up, and the contact numbers and emails of all directors sending students to second round. Be certain to identify handicapped and/or vision impaired students on this form as well – along with the necessary accommodations needed.

Alternates are Pre-Registered by phone only. Friday, October 6 is the pre-registration deadline for alternates. Only pre-registered students will be allowed to audition as per LMEA board policy. Contact me by phone no later than the pre-registration deadline to replace one of your students listed on your <u>second round pre-registration form</u> with <u>your district alternate</u>. NO WALK-IN AUDITIONS WILL BE ACCEPTED. Make sure you contact me with your changes no later than Thursday.

Should a district submit vacant audition slots in their initial 40-student allotment, I will contact district audition chairmen by phone in a sequential order to fill these vacancies. Any district accepting these open slots must pay the \$15 audition fee prior to the audition.

At Second Round Auditions (Saturday, October 14, 2017, Pineville High) every student is expected to present a STUDENT ID or other Photo ID at Sign-In.

Immediately After Second Round Auditions All Participating Directors Should Do The Following:

Check the LMEA website: <u>www.lmeamusic.org</u> for the posting of students selected as prospective All-State Choir members. Student registration forms (Form#1, Form#2, and the Academic Excellence Form) are on the LMEA website and must be printed, completed and returned to the address on the form. These forms will no longer be included in the student packet. **October 22** is the deadline to register students online and submit fee of \$60. *Payment is made to LMEA by school check or money order only. No personal checks accepted.*

Contact the director designated to distribute all-state registration packets for your district and arrange to pick-up your members' packets with urgency immediately after the audition weekend.

Directors, please make sure to go online and complete *your* Conference Registration. *Your registration for the convention is necessary in order for your students to participate.* You can send a copy of this form to me as well, but not necessary.

Be sure to reserve your conference hotel rooms on Tuesday, October 17, following second round auditions: Crowne Plaza Hotel, 4728 Constitution Avenue, Baton Rouge, 225-930-0174 or 225-930-0130.

Concert Attire for All-State Choir:

Girls: you will perform in your school's concert attire. If you do not have a concert dress, then you MUST wear a FULL LENGTH dress. Neither strapless nor backless dresses, nor high side slits may be worn. Black hose or stockings and black dress shoes preferably are required.

Boys: Your schools concert attire (must still have jacket and tie) / Tuxedo / or dark slacks, jacket and tie. Black socks and black dress shoes are required.

Now it's time to start thinking about All-State auditions and the LMEA Conference in November. There are some major announcements in the article about the 2017 All-State jazz auditions and conductor so please read all of the information below.



This year we are using NEW audition materials, including jazz scales and prepared etudes, so please be sure to visit the LMEA Jazz page on the website to explore it and share it with your students and other directors in your district. Currently only Set 1

(scales and prepared selections music and play-along tracks) is posted and available. Once we complete auditions this year and receive feedback about the new materials we will complete Sets 2, 3, and 4. These are major changes so please make sure your students have the correct music and scales.

For more information about the new audition materials and the audition recording process please refer to the LMEA website and click the link to the All-State Jazz information. We will again record the All-State Jazz Auditions by district. If you have students auditioning, be sure to check the LMEA website and reach out to your district director to find out when audition recordings will be made in your district. The deadline to receive all audition recordings is September 28. I would like to thank the members of Louisiana Association for Jazz Education for their assistance with the recordings. The recorded audition process has worked very well so far and I am sure it will continue to benefit all of our students interested in jazz, orchestra, and concert bands.

We are truly blessed this year to announce that the 2017 LMEA All-State Jazz Ensemble will be led by World-Renowned Musician, Composer, Conductor, Arranger **Wycliffe Gordon**. **Wycliffe is one of the nation's foremost music educators having held positions at Juilliard School of Music, Michigan State University**, Manhattan School of Music in the Jazz Arts Program he currently is Artist in Residence at Georgia Regents University in Augusta, GA. Gordon is regularly featured as guest faculty, teacher, clinician and conductor for All-State festivals, band clinics, the Louis Armstrong Summer Jazz Camp, the Int'l Trumpet Guild, the Int'l Trombone Festival and countless other high school and university programs and guest appearances. He is also the Artist in Residence for the third year now with the Louis Armstrong Legacy Project in Chicago. All State Bands

First-round all state auditions begin in September across our state. I am excited about many of the changes and innovations that we have implemented in the last year to make our auditions more streamlined and the calculation of scores more accurate and their distribution to directors and students faster. There are several new proposals that are in the planning stages that I am sure will continue our progress toward making our LMEA Bands the best they can be.

First-round auditions must be completed by September 30th. District Directors must verify two documents before a student is allowed to audition for first-round: NAfME membership for each participating director and a "Release of Information" form for each student. Additionally, it is crucial that we have senior preferences for band or orchestra so that students may be placed accordingly. If no preference is indicated, senior students will simply be assigned in the order they place. All first-round results need to be delivered to me via email no later than noon Sunday, October 1st. Please look for an email with the current allotment form in the near future.

This year, in an effort to close our budgetary gaps, we have implemented an increase of \$3 for the second-round audition fee. Second-round fees will now be \$15 per student/audition.

Second-round All-State auditions will be held on Saturday, October 14, 2017 at Pineville High School in Pineville, Louisiana. I would like to personally thank Mr. Johnny Walker for once again opening his facilities to our students. This is a large undertaking, and we could not do this without the help of band directors willing to give their time and services to our organization.



To streamline second-round auditions this year, we will be issuing actual audition times to district directors who will then distribute to the students in their districts. This is being done in an effort to eliminate the long wait times we have experienced in the past. Students will register a minimum of 30 minutes prior to their audition time There, they will receive their audition ticket and room assignment.

Of course, please contact me if you have any questions on any procedure for first or second-round auditions, and I will be happy to help you.

LMEA Conference

Our annual LMEA Conference will be held in Baton Rouge, Louisiana at the Crowne Plaza on November 16-20. We have a fantastic line-up of clinics, demonstration groups, concerts, exhibits, and social events for our band division members. Please make every effort to attend our conference.

Registration for the All State Band members will be on Saturday, November 18 from 4:00 – 4:45 PM in Cypress I of the Crowne Plaza.

"This above all: to thine own self be true, And it must follow, as the night the day, Thou canst not then be false to any man." - *William Shakespeare, Hamlet*

I can't remember the first time I heard this quotation; it seems to me I have known it forever. My incredible mother (may she rest in peace) said this whenever any of my siblings or I couldn't figure out what life choice to make. She abided by these words – in fact, it is engraved on her tombstone.

My mom was not a musician, but she <u>loved</u> music as did my dad. She sang to us – in a voice that was an octave lower than other moms – but, she was tuneful and knew instinctively that it was important for us to know songs: lullabies, marches,

Irish songs (our heritage on her side of the family), folk songs, sea chanteys, patriotic songs, and Christmas carols. I think she made sure I had piano lessons so that one day I could play Christmas carols for our family of five children and two parents, neighborhood children, grandparents – you get the idea. Beginning after dinner on Thanksgiving, we would all sing Christmas carols. As I got to be a slightly better player, the singers would make requests.

When I decided to major in music, she registered concerns because I didn't envision a career in teaching; however, her motto, "To thine own self be true", took precedence over her misgivings that I would not be able to make a career in music. I am so thankful to her, and to my dad, for supporting my academic decision. And, as I discovered after laboring at other jobs, my work with the children and adult choirs at my church led me to a teaching career after all. I have never looked back, and I have loved every minute of teaching.

Thanks to my parents, I have been involved in music in one way or the other since I was four. They gave me opportunities and nurtured my love of music. I hope they know how much I benefited from their love and support.

My goal in my classroom this year (my 36th!) is to encourage all my students to be true to themselves and to work to be their best selves. I trust that by continuing to have a safe, productive, and fun music classroom they will realize that being true to who you are is a great blessing.

Two people I adore are Lamar Robertson and Sandy Knudson. Both of them have been – and are – true to themselves always. I am thrilled that Lamar will be the LAKE-sponsored clinician at LMEA in November and that Sandy will be our main attraction! Their proposals sound incredible, and my knowledge of their work ensures that the sessions they present will prove "not-to-be-missed"!

Lamar will share three sessions: "Perfect Presentation Strengthens Musicianship", "Timeless Transitions That Transform Your Teaching", and "Powerful Practice Makes Proud Musicians".

Sandy will bring the following topics to us: "Let's Dance! Hall of Fame Nominations Sought

The Hall of Fame for Music Educators in Louisiana was instituted in 1982 and is sponsored by the LMEA, the purpose being to honor music educators who, by virtue of their contributions, are recognized as being the most highly regarded professional leaders in music education in Louisiana. A nominee, living or deceased, active or retired, should be or should have been:

1. A professional music educator who has made a longstanding, significant contribution to the school music program in Louisiana.

2. A person who has demonstrated a concern for music education by active involvement in local, district, state, regional or national professional organizations.

3. An active music educator or administrator in music education in a Louisiana school or institution of higher learning for a period of not less than twenty years.

4. An active member of the Louisiana Music Educators Association.

Persons wishing to submit names of candidates for induction into the LMEA Hall of Fame should send a letter of nomination, along with a biographical sketch, to the chairman of the LMEA Hall of Fame Committee, to be received no later than May 1st. The biographical sketch should include the achievements of the candidate in the criteria listed above. Nominees will not be considered without the biographical sketch. Inductees are selected by the Hall of Fame Committee by secret ballot. The current chairman of the LMEA Hall of Fame Committee is Tom Wafer, 1834 Wimpole Drive, Baton Rouge, Louisiana 70815.

The Louisiana Music Educators Association is pleased to announce a call for research reports for presentation at a Research Poster Session at the LMEA Conference. Posters will be on display during the conference with special presentation session on November 19, 2017.

Research studies exemplifying qualitative, quantitative, philosophical and historical methodologies will be considered for this session. Submissions of "Graduate Research" and "Action Research" completed by music educators in his or her classroom/rehearsal hall are also encouraged. Authors whose reports are selected will present their research during a research poster session in which interested music educators can learn about the research and discuss applications to music teaching and learning with the authors.

Research on Advocacy, Band, Classroom Music (Elementary, Middle or High School), Choral, Curriculum Development/Assessment, Early Childhood, Guitar, Higher Education, Jazz, Leadership/Mentoring, Music Theory, Orchestra/Strings, Special Learners, SMTE ASPA Research, Technology, Urban/World Music, Music Pedagogy, and Music and Music Education Research will be accepted.

LMEA Outstanding School Administrator Award

Awards and presentations will be made annually to outstanding school principals and/or superintendents who demonstrate support for and commitment to high-quality arts education programs in their schools. The influence of such administrators is a major factor in improving music education in school systems across the state. Elementary school principals, secondary school principals and school district superintendents may be selected to receive this award. Individuals holding titles as assistant principal and assistant or associate superintendent also qualify. This award is not intended to honor music supervisors, music coordinators, etc. Administrators receiving awards will be notified by the LMEA Executive Board and a presentation honoring them will take place at the LMEA Annual Conference.

Selection by the LMEA Committee will be based on the following criteria:

- 1. The school or school district under the administrator's supervision must have an exemplary music program, with the majority of the music staff holding LMEA membership.
- 2. The administrator must have served in the administrative position in the same school or district for no less than three years.
- 3. The administrator must be an active advocate for arts education in the school and community.
- 4. A financial commitment to music programs must be demonstrated in the school or school district.
- 5. The administrators must show strong leadership, good school management, and good rapport with teachers, parents, students, and other administrators.
- 6. Music supervisors/coordinators are not eligible for this award.

Nominators must submit the following for each administrator:

- 1. Completed School Administrator nomination Form verified and signed by the nominator.
- 2. Resume of nominated administrator.
- 3. Two letters of support, including one from the music education faculty in the administrator's school district.
- 4. A picture of the administrator suitable for publicity purposes.
- 5. Name and address of the administrator's local newspaper, television and radio station where applicable.
- 6. Additional support materials such as press clippings if available.


