The LMEA portion of your NAfME membership is currently \$25.00. The proposal will increase your LMEA membership cost but would encompass things like your current conference registration. This change will require a vote by the entire membership and more information will be available as the board moves forward.



All State Bands

First-round all state auditions begin in September across our state. I am excited about many of the changes and innovations that we have implemented in the last year to make our auditions more streamlined and the calculation of scores more accurate and their distribution to directors and students faster. There are several changes that will impact the selection of students at both first and second round this year.

First is the method by which students will be selected at first round.

- All districts will require students to perform all 12 major scales and the chromatic scale, all etudes (with cuts allowed), and sightreading at first round as prescribed in the LMEA Handbook.
 - All districts will use the scoring system prescribed in the LMEA Handbook.
 - No student will progress to second round whose total score does not equal at least 50% of the highest score in the district on that particular instrument. (50% rule).
 - Allotment forms will require the inclusion of total scores for each student listed.
 - Allotment forms will include additional alternate positions to broaden the pool for second round in the event of the need to call up alternates. First alternates will receive priority over second alternates, etc.


Second is a change to the allotment of several instruments. As you may recall, the LMEA board voted to eliminate the Bass Trombone audition. Additionally, the ration of first round to second round placement was skewed on several instruments. To allow for more student participation we have amended the following:

- Trombone increase to 5 tenor trombones per district
- Euphonium and tuba increase to 4 per district

Third, we have added provisions to allow districts with exceptional showings at second round to expand their positions in the future.

- In the event a district places all of its allotted students on a single instrument into all-state, that district will receive one additional allotment the following year in that particular instrument.
- If after receiving an additional allotment, the district places all students into all-state including the additional allotment, the district will receive another additional allotment.
- If a district places all of its allotment into all state and places additional students into all-state due to alternates, that district will receive one additional allotment beyond the alternates placed.
- If a district fails to place all of its allotment into all-state, the district will return to its original allotment.





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Please also note that snare drum etudes have been changed as of last year. Of this information was distributed through the district directors las January. Please consult the LMEA Website for the most accurate and up to date requirements.

First-round auditions must be completed by September 30th. District Directors must verify two documents before a student is allowed to audition for first-round: NAfME membership for each participating director and a "Release of Information" form for each student. Additionally, it is crucial that we have senior preferences for band or orchestra so that students may be placed accordingly. If no preference is indicated, senior students will simply be assigned in the order they place. All first-round results need to be delivered to me via email no later than noon Monday, October 1st. Please look for an email with the current allotment form in the near future.

Of course, please contact me if you have any questions on any procedure for first or second-round auditions, and I will be happy to help you.

All State Band Clinicians

We have a fantastic line-up of clinics, demonstration groups, concerts, exhibits, and social events for our band division members. Please make every effort to attend our conference.

This year's clinicians for our All-State Symphonic Band is Steven D. Davis of the University of Missouri-Kansas City Conservatory of Music and Dance. Dr. Davis is a lauded, versatile, and cosmopolitan conductor who has inspired ensembles around the world. In constant demand as a guest conductor, he has conducted across four continents, working with ensembles in cities such as Bangkok, Beijing, Lisbon, Sydney, and regularly conducts in his favorite city, Kansas City. § His most recent guest conducting and teaching engagements include the Eastman Wind Ensemble, Beijing Modern Music Festival, and the Texas All-State Symphonic Band. Davis has, for many years, served on the Orchestra and Wind Ensemble conducting faculty of the Interlochen Summer Arts Camp.

All-State Concert Band clinician Catherine Rand of the University of Southern Mississippi.

Dr. Rand maintains an active schedule as a guest conductor, clinician, adjudicator, and guest lecturer throughout the United States and abroad. Catherine Rand came to Southern Miss from her position as Director of Bands and Area Coordinator of Winds and Percussion at Florida International University, where she conducted the Wind Ensemble, Chamber Winds, and taught wind literature and graduate conducting.



I hope everyone had a wonderful summer break and that you are ready for a great school year for all of your programs. It's time to start thinking about All-State auditions and the LMEA Conference in November. There are important announcements in the article about the 2018 All-State jazz auditions and conductor so please read all of the information below.

This year's NEW audition materials are available on the website, including jazz scales sheets for each instrument, prepared etudes, and the play-along mp3 files for the etudes. Please be sure to visit the LMEA Jazz page on the website to explore it and share it with your students and other directors in your district. Set 2 (scales and prepared selections music and play-along tracks) is posted and available. After completing this year's auditions, we will again ask for feedback about the new materials so we can continue to improve this process and development for our state jazz auditions. Please be sure your students have the correct music and scales for the auditions.



We will again record the All-State Jazz Auditions by district. If you have students auditioning, be sure to check the LMEA website and reach out to your district director to find out when audition recordings will be made in your district. The deadline to receive all audition recordings is September 17. I would like to thank the members of Louisiana Association for Jazz Education for their assistance with the recordings. The recorded audition process has worked out fantastically and I am sure it will continue to benefit all of our students interested in jazz, orchestra, and concert bands.

We are truly blessed this year to announce that the 2018 LMEA All-State Jazz Ensemble will be led by Ronald Carter, the former director of the worldrenowned Northern Illinois University (NIU) Jazz Ensemble and former Director of Jazz Studies is continuing to educate students in jazz education and performance on university, high school and performing arts schools and campuses across the country, South America and Canada.

As an educator, Carter has presented workshops as guest conductor, artist, clinician, or adjudicator at regional, national, and international conferences, and directed all-state jazz bands in Illinois, Indiana, Rhode Island, Missouri, Texas, Wisconsin, Colorado, Iowa, Maine, Kentucky, Vermont, Arizona, Kansas, Arkansas, Tennessee, South Carolina, North Carolina, Georgia, Washington, Oregon and Massachusetts. Carter conducted the Florida State University Tri -State All-Star Jazz band in 2017. Carter who worked 18 years in the East St. Louis School District as the former director of the Lincoln Senior High School Jazz Band, also performed professionally in the St. Louis metropolitan area as a freelance musician on saxophone, clarinet, flute, and as a vocalist. He co-directed the group Infiniti and performed with the legendary George Hudson Orchestra. Carter has also performed professionally with Clark Terry, Jimmy Heath, Lena Horne, Lou Rawls, The Jimmy Dorsey Band, Wallace Roney, The Temptations, The Dells, Oliver Lake, Hamiett Bluiett, Leon Thomas, Art Davis, Fareed Haque, Joseph Bowie, Frank Mantooth, Terell Stafford, Orbert Davis, Carl Allen, Rodney Whitaker, and many others.

An abbreviated list of his honors and awards includes Downbeat Magazine's Jazz Educators Hall of Fame, The Woody Herman Music Award (Birch Creek Music Center), The 1991 Milken National Distinguished Educator Award, Southern Illinois University Excellence in Teaching Award, and the St. Louis American Newspaper's Excellence in Teaching Award and Northern Illinois University Board of Trustees Professorship. Recently accepted appointment as Felton J. Capel Distinguished Professor of Performing and Fine Arts UNC - Fayetteville State University, Fayetteville, NC.

Carter's projects include former International Consultant for the Essentially Ellington Jazz Competition sponsored by Jazz at Lincoln Center in New York; former Lead Artist for the Jazz At Lincoln Center Band Director's Academy; Co-Author for Alfred Publications "Swingin' On The Bars", and co-author of GIA Music Publications "Teaching Music Through Performance in Jazz - Book I & II as well as a contributing author to the Beginning Jazz Ensemble Textbook.





Should a district submit vacant audition slots in their initial 40-student allotment, I will contact district audition chairpersons by phone in a sequential order to fill these vacancies. Any district accepting these open slots must pay the \$15 audition fee prior to the audition.

Immediately After Second Round Auditions, All Directors Should Do The Following:

Check the LMEA website: www.lmeamusic.org for the posting of students selected as prospective All-State Choir members. Student registration forms (Form #1, Form 2, and the Academic Excellence Form) are on the website and must be printed, completed, and returned to the address on the form. These forms



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will not be in the student packet. October 22 is the deadline to submit the three completed forms along with the registration fee of \$65. Submit payment to LMEA via the website using a credit/debit card by 10/22 or a school check or money order postmarked by 10/22. No personal checks accepted.

Contact the director designated to distribute all-state registration packets for your district and arrange to pick-up your members' packets the week following auditions. Packets contain time sensitive information that requires urgency in getting information in the hands of parents and students.

Supervise the completion and mailing of student all-state packet forms and fee check. Mail all of your school's entries in one envelope. Your involvement improves the efficiency of this process.

Directors, please complete your Conference Registration and pay online by October 22. Your registration for the conference is necessary in order for your students to participate.

Be sure to reserve your conference hotel rooms on Monday, October 15 following second round auditions.

Persons wishing to submit names of candidates for induction into the LMEA Hall of Fame should send a letter of nomination, along with a biographical sketch, to the chairman of the LMEA Hall of Fame Committee, to be received no later than May 1st. The biographical sketch should include the achievements of the candidate in the criteria listed above. Nominees will not be considered without the biographical sketch. Inductees are selected by the Hall of Fame Committee by secret ballot. The current chairman of the LMEA Hall of Fame Committee is Tom Wafer, 1834 Wimpole Drive, Baton Rouge, Louisiana 70815.

Louisiana Music Educators Association All-State Conference Crowne Plaza Executive Center Baton Rouge, Louisiana November 15-19, 2018

The Louisiana Music Educators Association is pleased to announce a call for research reports for presentation at a Research Poster Session at the LMEA Conference. Posters will be on display during the conference with special presentation session on November 18, 2018.

Research studies exemplifying qualitative, quantitative, philosophical and historical methodologies will be considered for this session. Submissions of "Graduate Research" and "Action Research" completed by music educators in his or her classroom/rehearsal hall are also encouraged. Authors whose reports are selected will present their research during a research poster session in which interested music educators can learn about the research and discuss applications to music teaching and learning with the authors.

Research on Advocacy, Band, Classroom Music (Elementary, Middle or High School), Choral, Curriculum Development/Assessment, Early Childhood, Guitar, Higher Education, Jazz, Leadership/Mentoring, Music Theory, Orchestra/Strings, Special Learners, SMTE ASPA Research, Technology, Urban/World Music, Music Pedagogy, and Music and Music Education Research will be accepted.

Traditional posters (30" x 40") as well as electronic posters will be displayed. Researchers choosing to bring electronic media need to provide their own equipment and power supply/ battery. The author(s) of each accepted paper will be present at the poster session on November 18, 2018 to discuss their project with other interested music educators. The author(s) should furnish 20 copies of the abstract at the presentation.

To submit a proposal:

- 1. Only electronic submissions will be considered. Submit one file containing an abstract not to exceed 250 words, with no title page. The report should contain no clues as to author identity or institutional affiliation. Label the file with title or partial title of the study. In the body of the e-mail, please include the following information: (a) the author's or authors' names, (b) current position(s) and institutional affiliation(s), (c) mailing address, telephone number, and e-mail address (submitter only), (d) the report's title, and (e) the abstract. Send the file as an attachment in Word Document (.doc; .docx) or Portable Document (.pdf) format. Other formats will not be accepted. Submissions may be reports of completed or in-progress research.

LMEA Outstanding School Administrator Award

Awards and presentations will be made annually to outstanding school principals and/or superintendents who demonstrate support for and commitment to high-quality arts education programs in their schools. The influence of such administrators is a major factor in improving music education in school systems across the state. Elementary school principals, secondary school principals and school district superintendents may be selected to receive this award. Individuals holding titles as assistant principal and assistant or associate superintendent also qualify. This award is not intended to honor music supervisors, music coordinators, etc. Administrators receiving awards will be notified by the LMEA Executive Board and a presentation honoring them will take place at the LMEA Annual Conference.

Selection by the LMEA Committee will be based on the following criteria:

- 1. The school or school district under the administrator's supervision must have an exemplary music program, with the majority of the music staff holding LMEA membership.
- 2. The administrator must have served in the administrative position in the same school or district for no less than three years.
- 3. The administrator must be an active advocate for arts education in the school and community.
- 4. A financial commitment to music programs must be demonstrated in the school or school district.
- 5. The administrators must show strong leadership, good school management, and good rapport with teachers, parents, students, and other administrators.
- 6. Music supervisors/coordinators are not eligible for this award.

Nominators must submit the following for each administrator:

- 1. Completed School Administrator nomination Form verified and signed by the nominator.
- 2. Resume of nominated administrator.
- 3. Two letters of support, including one from the music education faculty in the administrator's school district.
- 4. A picture of the administrator suitable for publicity purposes.
- 5. Name and address of the administrator's local newspaper, television and radio station where applicable.
- 6. Additional support materials such as press clippings if available.
