Sight-reading Requirements Sight-reading is required for all bands and wind ensembles in classes AAAA, AAA, AA, B, D, F, and all groups with a 7, 8, or 9 preceding their classification. Sight-reading is optional for all other groups. (This statement should have been removed). Ensembles that opt for Comments Only on stage will be required to sight-read for Comments Only. They will have the option to sight-read one level below the required selection, if one exists. This includes class G with 100% beginners.

Class G will read the lowest classification.	
Page 3 information was missed and not accurate.	

CLASS G: 100% beginners. In class G, sight-reading will not be required at the district level unless the group plans to participate in the state music assessment.

Should read (to match page 4):

Class G: 100% beginners. In class G, sight-reading will be required.
